So three of the biggest posts of responsibility are up for grabs. (Or due to be hoisted onto anyone not quick enough to avoid volunteering!)



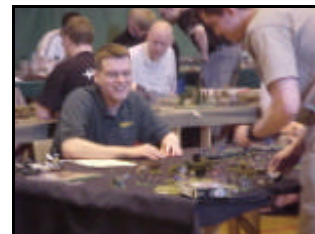
Members should be aware that nominations for these posts need to be in by September 1st. And the AGM will be held at the club meeting on 29th September.

Club Challenge

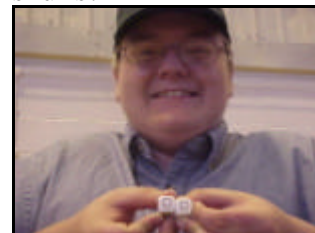
The weekend of 28-29th May saw the WPS club challenge with a strong contingent of Gobstyk players.

As you can see, even Andy Dodd smiled!

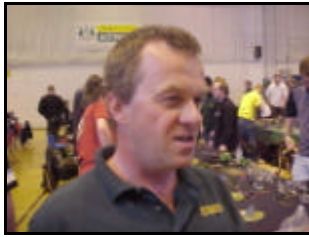


'Little' Will decided to roll as many double skulls on day one as he could. He achieved his goal of getting the 1 in 1296 chance of consecutive double skulls!

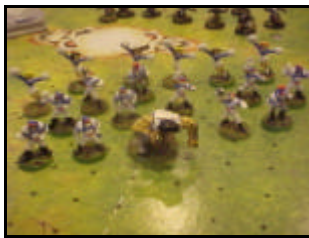


The other Blood bowl results saw Tim Pickers

Hopefully some of you will be reading this newsletter after taking part in a game at the shop.

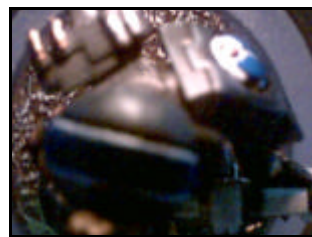
We are always looking at ways to encourage new players to come through our doors, so if you have any suggestions, please don't hesitate to ask.
